

Patrick Balducci has 25 years of professional experience as an economist and project manager. He currently serves as a Chief Economist at the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory (PNNL) where he has been employed since 2001. He is currently leading the industry acceptance area of the PNNL Energy Storage Program, and has extensive experience in modeling the benefits of energy infrastructure and in leading research and development efforts supporting the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) and the electric power industry. He has authored over 130 publications, including journal articles, conference proceedings, and technical reports and is currently leading research efforts evaluating the benefits of 1.6 GW / 18 GWh in energy storage capacity at 16 sites across the U.S. He is also leading efforts to enhance economic assessment tools for the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE). He serves on the Board of Directors of the Pacific Northwest Regional Economics Conference. He holds a BS in Economics from Lewis and Clark College, where he graduated with honors, and an MSc in Applied Environmental Economics from the University of London, Imperial College of London.
